TRIP TO CHICAGO SHAKESPEARE THEATER!

Dear Students and Parents,

The trip to Navy Pier is coming up on Monday, February 24, 2025 to see Shakespeare's <u>A Midsummer Night's</u> <u>Dream.</u> We are planning on all current students in grades 7-12 attending, which amounts to 36 people: 5 adults and 31 students. The school has already paid \$15 for each current student's play ticket. However, every person must pay \$25 for the charter bus fare. We will board the bus at 8:45 am at Princeton Christian Academy and will return to PCA around 6:00 pm. Please bring money for lunch and shopping and possibly dinner, your cell phones for safety purposes, and any snacks you prefer. You may bring a light jacket if desired, although we will be inside the most of the time. If the weather is nice, travel as lightly as you can. McDonald's, Potbelly's, and Giordano's accept cash, but all shops and rides require a credit card. Please arrange to have a credit card with for other expenses.

Those who are not current students will need to pay \$15 for their play tickets, as well as \$25 bus fare.

When we arrive at the Pier, we will eat lunch at a restaurant of your choice. We must be at the Theater by noon for the 12:30 performance. After the play there is a question and answer time, so we will depart the theater about 2:15. Then you are free to shop, eat ice cream, etc. until we meet at 3:45 at the entrance to Navy Pier to board the bus. Each parent will be assigned a group of students to check in with periodically. **Students are required** to stay in groups of two or more at all times on the Pier, even when going to the restrooms. No one is allowed to leave the Pier at any time other than on the bus. Cell phone numbers will be supplied for assistance if needed at any time. The bus will not stop for dinner on the way home, so if you can't wait to eat dinner, buy something to eat on the bus before we leave.








Our Valentine's Day party will be on Friday, February 14th from 1:00 to 2:55. Don't forget to be working on a holder for valentines.

Our in house speech contest is tomorrow! Parents are welcome to come and watch. We think our time will be about 9:15 or so.

Bible: We are learning about Job. We will see how he was patient and did not turn from God even in the midst of all his suffering. We will see how God can use even suffering to further his plan and our spiritual growth. Our verse is Ephesians 4:2, "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love." We will recite this verse on Friday.

Phonics and Language: We are continuing to diagram the simple subject and predicates of sentences. We are learning how to use the verbs, may, can, learn, and teach correctly in a sentence.

Spelling: We are studying list 19 words. Spelling test 19 will be given on Friday.

Math: We are continuing to learn how to multiply. We are also learning the parts of a multiplication fact. We have added the 18 addition fact family and will add more Roman numerals. We will also subtract with borrowing in the hundreds place.

Science: We are learning about the human body and the five senses. We've talked about our nervous system and our eyes.
